A Word from the President Robin Cravey

Neighborhood Power in a Changing World

Just about twenty years ago, with a new baby in arms, my wife Jane and I moved into our little house at the southern edge of the Zilker neighborhood. We could afford our house, with parental help, in part because it had a little rent house in the back yard that provided some income. We chose this neighborhood for a lot of reasons, including mature shade trees, a connected street layout, and easy walking distance to downtown and to Zilker Park. As we raised our children, and got to know the neighborhood, we learned to appreciate other aspects. Its natural integration meant our children could walk to the neighborhood school and still attend a racially mixed school. We felt at home among the broad-minded citizens living here.

Today the neighborhood still possesses all the qualities that brought us here. But it is facing a flood of challenges. Whether we wish it or not, population pressure on the neighborhood keeps mounting. Population growth worldwide and nationwide continues, and Austin's allure means that the area, and the neighborhood, will have to accommodate new residents. This places a strain on services and facilities. Worse, if every new resident must drive solitary in a car, our streets will be choked and dangerous, and our air will be fouled. Too, as new residents move into work in lucrative new industries, folks working in the city's traditional sectors of government and higher education worry about being priced out of the neighborhood. And things could be even grimmer for people working at the lower margin of the wage scale. All these people live in our neighborhood.

What can the Zilker Neighborhood Association do about all these challenges? With your effort and good will, the association can do a lot. As Austin grows, the city government will find it sensible to delegate authority to neighborhoods. In a city where neighborhoods have always wielded political power, this developing authority will be welcome. And with authority comes responsibility. We can take control of our destiny, if we work together to develop a common vision of our neighborhood and then work even harder to realize it..
